

Oregon's Unemployment Rate Was 4.1% in December 2021






The number of unemployed Oregonians continues to fall.



Local Area Unemployment Statistics










A Demand vs. Supply Issue Labor Force Needs



Oregon's labor force growth has leveled off in recent months.




2011 to Present



Net migration into Oregon is a source of labor force supply. It also grows the economy by increasing the demand for products and services.


Components of Oregon's Annual Population Change

Oregon Labor Force Participation Rates by Age Group






The Mid-Valley's labor force participation rate has been declining since 2016.









Nearly 20 percent of Yamhill County's employment is in Manufacturing. Statewide the industry comprises 10 percent.

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

The number of Mid-Valley vacancies was higher in 2021 than at any time in the survey's history since 2015.






Most of the jobs lost in Oregon since February 2020 were in industries with wages below the statewide average of \$59,915 per year.

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


Oregon Job Change and Average Pay by Industry

Three out of 10 vacancies in the Mid-Valley pay less than \$15 per hour, and another 35% pay starting wages between \$15 and \$19.99.



Employers in the Mid-Valley had a high rate of difficulty filling their vacancies at all wage levels, whereas in many areas higher-wage vacancies proved more difficult.



Almost half (45%) of all Mid-Valley vacancies require previous work experience.
